

The Berrima region was originally inhabited by the indigenous "Gundungurra" people. European exploration of the area began as early as 1798. The Hume brothers passed through in 1814. John Oxley established a station after droving cattle here in search of new pastures in 1815.

Interesting fact: Did you know the Southern Highlands climate and rainfall is some of the most varied in Australia for such a small region. For example: on average Robertson gets 5093 mm rainfall per annum. Only 40 kilometres away in Joadja the average rainfall is 083mm– a difference of 1010mm!

4. BERRIMA DISTRICT HISTORICAL & FAMILY HISTORY SOCIETY



The *Berrima Historical Society* was founded in 1960 to encourage the study of Australian, local and family history, to establish a museum and a permanent archive for the preservation of the documentary and material heritage of the Southern Highlands of New South Wales. Their Collections cover the major towns of Bowral, Mittagong, Moss Vale, Robertson and Berrima and the many villages.

The Society has an extensive collection of photographs and pictures relating to the Southern Highlands and beyond, dating from the 1870's. They have catalogued and digitised more than 8,000 images and these have been gradually added to the online Image Library. To search for photos of people, houses, buildings, streetscapes and more, visit Berrima District Historical Society photo search page. Membership is open to all with an interest in history, genealogy, museums and heritage conservation.

6. THE BRADMAN MUSEUM AND INTERNATIONAL CRICKET HALL OF FAME

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7. HARPERS MANSION & MAZE



On a hill overlooking the historic village of Berrima, Harper's Mansion was built in 1834. This fine Georgian homestead was built by James Harper, assistant to the Surveyor General Thomas Mitchell. The house is set on two acres of strolling gardens and features one of the largest hedge mazes in Australia. The **maze** was planted in 2000 and now is over 3 metres tall. The total length of the path is 350 metres.

Harper's Mansion is listed on the NSW Government Heritage Roster as a property of State heritage significance and is furnished in period style and on display to the public

on weekends and public holidays. You can take in this magnificent mansion on the Berrima Heritage Walk. *Interesting Fact: The Roman Catholic Church bought the house in 1853 using it as a presbytery until 1898.*

8. TRAINWORKS - THIRLMERE

Just 38 minutes from the Berrima Motel is the historic town of Thirlmere, which has since 1975 been home to a significant rail heritage collection, including over 100 rolling stock items, associate with the history of the railways in NSW. Take a ride back into history aboard an historic steam train! A 45 minute experience from Thirlmere Station to Buxton Station, and return. Pair



your Steam Train Ride with a ticket into Trainworks and get a full day of rail heritage, interactive and audio-visual exhibits at the nation's **newest and largest Train Museum**.

Thirlmere was once a booming town of tents for the many railway workers who create the Great Southern Railway from 1863 to 1867. The Heritage Precinct has witnessed the full gamut of Southern Highland colonial history.

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9. JOADJA CREEK TOURS

Explore the historic valley of *Joadja*, a pocket of national heritage nestled away in the Southern Highlands. Only 25kms west of Mittagong, Joadja town was founded on a shale seam and the Scottish workers brought out to mine it. The mine closed early in the 20th century, and the town was abandoned. The buildings were left to the elements, and nature has slowly regained its hold on much of the valley. The ruins that remain, tell the story of those that lived, worked and perished here.



The mining technology that made the valley so prosperous in its time stands as the last of its kind in the world. Joadja truly is a gem of world heritage significance and an intriguing part of Australia's industrial history. With fully guided and self-guided tours on offer, Joadja is a great day out for the whole family.
